MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT BETWEEN SHILOH POLICE DEPARTMENT AND PINE MOUNTAIN POLICE DEPARTMENT

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide for cooperation and mutual aid between the Shiloh Police Department and the Pine Mountain Police Department whenever either agency requires assistance in carrying out its law enforcement responsibilities. Such assistance may include but is not limited to emergency response; criminal investigations; traffic enforcement; search warrant execution; disaster response; crowd control and special events; tactical operations; missing person search; and other lawful law enforcement purposes.

Mr. Trott made a motion to approve the Mutual Aid Agreement.

Mr. Pound seconded the motion.

Mr. Scott, Mr. Bray, and Ms. Mabry voted in favor of the motion.

BUILDING DEDICATION OF POLICE DEPARTMENT TO DAVID WHITE-Carl White

Mr. Carl White requested that the Police Department building be dedicated to his father Carl David White naming it Carl David White Facility. Mr. White worked for the Town for 35 years with 27 years being the Police Chief.

Mr. Scott stated that this was discussed another time, and it was decided to place a plaque in the police department with his name on it. Mr. Scott does not agree with dedicating the entire building to Mr. White because it also has EMS and Fire Department in it.

Ms. Mabry made a motion to dedicate the entire building to Carl David White.

Mr. Bray seconded the motion.

Mr. Trott and Mr. Pound voted in favor of the motion.

Mr. Scott voted against the motion.

Mr. McKee asked permission to have the Christmas Parade on December 5th at 2:00 P.M. We will need to contact DOT with the route and get approval from them.

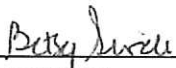
Mr. McKee also asked permission to have a food truck across from the bank in a couple of parking spaces.

Mr. Pound seconded the motion.

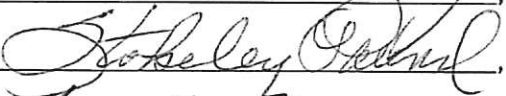
Mr. Scott, Ms. Mabry, and Mr. Trott voted in favor of the motion.

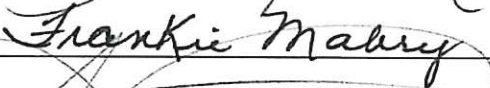
Thereafter, the meeting was adjourned



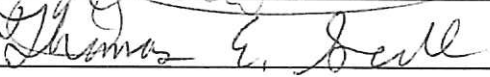
