PUBLIC WORKS

Justin Oliver, Public Works Superintendent, provided the following report:

POLICE CHIEF

MAYOR AND COUNCIL INCREASE IN COMPENSATION

Council approved the increase at the May meeting to increase the salaries to \$6,000 annually for mayor and \$4,500 annually for council members.

Mr. Pound and Mr. Bray voted against the motion.

INSTALL A PATRIOT MARKER IN THE CIRCLE IN FRONT OF VETERANS MEMORIAL

Mrs. Keating requested permission to place a Patriot Marker in front of the Veterans Memorial. This marker commemorates the men and women who achieved American Independence. These Patriots, each believing in the noble cause of liberty, fought valiantly to form a new nation. Dedicated in 2027 by the King's Gap Charter of the Daughters of the American Revolution in celebration of the 250th Anniversary of the United States.

Mr. Scott made a motion to grant permission for this request.

STOP SIGN REQUEST WILLIAMS AVENUE & HARRIS STREET-Malcolm Citron

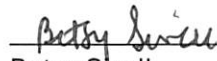
Mr. Citron was requesting a 4-way stop on Williams Avenue & Harris Street.

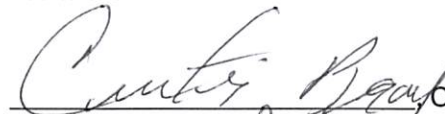
Mr. Oliver had already discussed having one at this location.

Mayor Mullins presented the first reading for a juvenile curfew ordinance.

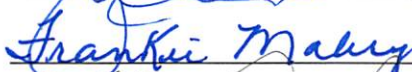
Thereafter, the meeting was adjourned.

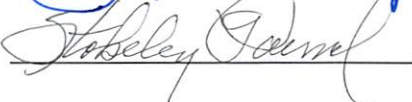
